Secondly, paying money for visiting places isn't something new: cinemas, concerts, etc. Therefore paying to visit museums shouldn't be surprising. The only positive

side in "free-of-charge" system for museums is that it can stimulate people to visit ^{visit} said museums. But I don't think that it outweighs everything that I've mentioned above.

As you can see, charging people for admission to museums is completely rational and explainable. I would recommend you to visit your local museum when you get a proper opportunity. And of course, don't forget to pay for the ticket.
