### The Story I Wish to See on the Screen

The book, even though telling about talking animals, is <sup>150</sup> largely realistic. Keeping this way of story telling in a film is <sup>160</sup> very hard. The whole <sup>170</sup> cast of characters are animals and would be 2D or 3D models. So it would be <sup>180</sup> crucial to get <sup>190</sup> talented animators working on the film. Making characters <sup>200</sup> expressive and <sup>210</sup> show emotion would also be rather difficult. Another <sup>220</sup> challenge is the length of the story. A book format allows for much longer stories than films, so the <sup>230</sup> filmmaker would probably have to cut some moments out.

In conclusion <sup>240</sup> I'd like to say that, unfortunately, "Guardians of Ga'Hoole" will probably <sup>250</sup> never get a screen version because it's rather old and not popular, but I will continue hoping that <sup>260</sup> more people will get to <sup>270</sup> experience this amazing creation.
